“The Persians were defeated and the territories were recovered by the emperor Heraclius in 627, but the unexpected appearance of the newly converted and united Muslim Arabs took by surprise an Empire exhausted by the titanic effort against Persia, and the southern provinces were all overrun. Mesopotamia, Syria, Egypt, and the Exarchate of Africa were permanently incorporated into the Muslim Empire in the 7th century, a process which was completed with the fall of Carthage to the Caliphate in 698”.

Definition of Byzantine: The name *Byzantine Empire* is derived from the original Greek name for Constantinople, Byzantium. The name is a modern term and would have been alien to its contemporaries. The Empire's native Greek name was **Ῥωμανία** *Romanía* or **Βασιλεία Ῥωμαίων** *Basileía Romaíon*, a direct translation of the Latin name of the Roman Empire, *Imperium Romanorum*.
